1. Describe a time in your life when hope for the future gave you strength in the present.
2. **Read Revelation 1:1-11.** Revelation was written by the apostle John to churches in Asia Minor who were experiencing persecution. We live in the same fallen world that those early Christians did so we face our own challenges and trials and likewise need hope. What is a situation in your life right now that is discouraging or draining you?
3. **Read Revelation 21:1-5, 22-26.** What sticks out to you or what element do you find particularly powerful from this description of the future new heaven and new earth?
4. **Read Revelation 22:1-5.** Helder made the case that the best of the best of what's to come is that "they will see His face." How does getting to see God face-to-face one day give you hope in your current situation?
5. **Read Exodus 33:20-23 & John 1:18.** How do these verses add to the understanding of the significance that "they will see His face"?
6. **Read Revelation 22:4.** There are thousands in our community, including dozens or even hundreds that you know personally, who do not yet have this hope. How can you bring this hope to the people in your household, neighborhood, workplace, or city this week?

QUESTIONS FOR KIDS

1. Is there anything that is worrying or troubling you right now? Talk about it with your family.
2. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego knew that God was able to save them. What does "God is able" mean to you?
3. Does thinking about who God is make your worries seem smaller? What about the truth that God never abandons us or leaves us alone?
